Forms to report an incident are on the inside of the yellow and tan brochures.

SUMMER READING: The Tech-Wise Family



After a year of being so reliant upon our screens at school, work, and home, this summer may provide the perfect opportunity to reevaluate the proper place for technology. Sometimes, it feels like our devices have a lot more control over us than we have over them. But it doesn't have to be this way. In The Tech-Wise Family, Andy Crouch (previously an editor and producer at Christianity Today) provides eve-

ryday steps for putting technology in its proper place. Making good choices about technology is more than just using internet filters and limiting "screen time." It's about developing wisdom, character, and courage in the way we use digital media, rather than accepting technology's promises of ease, instant gratification, and the world's knowledge at our fingertips. Crouch helps readers ask deeper questions about tech and family life: Who do we want to be as a family? How does our use of a particular technology move us closer or farther away from that goal? This book is for ANYONE who wants to reclaim real life in a world of devices. It is easy to read, practical, helpful, and challenging. I highly recommend it for anyone, with or without children in your home. There will be five copies of the book available to check out from the church office.

FOC & STEWARDSHIP

Thank you for your generosity! This is how UPC stands financially at the end of April 2021: Total Income 106,406.74; 48.34% of 2021 operating budget. Total Expenses \$80121.38; 32.78% of 2021 operating budget. The ministry of UPC continues and relies on your generosity. Please consider sending your tithes and offerings through the <u>on-line giving</u> on the UPC website or mail through the US postal service. On-line is very easy and categories that you can choose from have been created to direct your donation to the correct place. There is a "Notes" box at the end of the form which will allow you to be more specific if you so desire. We now have a new fund on our on-line giving. It is called <u>Miscellaneous Non-Charitable Payment</u>. This can be used for such things as Easter Flowers, Congregational Life events such as the Faith Day at the Rockies, Mission nuts sales, VBS donation, etc.

MISISON UPDATES

We are grateful for the terrific response to the **One Great Hour of Sharing** Special Offering (OGHS). We'll be sending \$1870 to Presbyterian Church (USA). We hope that you'll take the time to go to the OGHS website to see the wide variety of projects support by these funds from reclaiming wages for service workers in the USA to planting tree worldwide to special water projects. We have hard work to do and loads to lift; Shun not the struggle –face it; 'tis God's gift. (Babcock)

In May, UPC met the special request from the **Food Pantry** by providing food items for diabetics.

• A check for \$500 was sent to the **Cathedral Hom**e to support their highly successful therapeutic equestrian program.

A small donation (\$100) was sent to support the national group of Presbyterian churches addressing the **Syrian/Lebanese issues**. This group offers the fall and spring virtual "gatherings" where we can ask our questions directly to Presbyterian ministers in Syria and Lebanon.

• We have just learned from the Presbytery's Team that the \$3000 that was being sent to support the **Children of the World Medical Center** developed by the Aleppo Presbyterian Church has now grown to \$11,000. Hopefully, this money can soon transverse the complicated journey to get to where it is desperately needed.

• Many thanks to those of you who have been leaving **clothing** on Nancy Lick's stoop (1765 N 22nd). All clothing is needed and welcomed. It is sorted for the following: SAFE; Wind River; the Clothing Cottage; the Laramie schools; Goodwill; Community Holidays (new items); and the University of Wyoming International Student Giveaway.

• Nancy Weidel reports that the **Grow Our Own Project** at Wind River received funding to build 50 more planter boxes to add to the 75 that their volunteers built over the winter. They have also received a grant from the University of Wyoming to collect data on specific areas of concern. Efforts are underway for UPC members to spend a couple of days at Wind River at the end of August. Please stay tuned for details as they are finalized.

• Diana Denison and Nancy Fillian are working hard on a **July work-shop** that will take place out-of-doors. Watch for the details.
