Thank you for your generosity! This is how UPC stands financially at the end of October 2021: Total Income 181,653.82; 82.52% of 2021 operating budget. Total Expenses \$208,086.11; 85.13% of 2021 operating budget. The ministry of UPC continues and relies on your generosity. Please consider sending your tithes and offerings through the <u>on-line giving</u> on the UPC website or mail through the US postal service. On-line is very easy and categories that you can choose from have been created to direct your donation to the correct place. There is a "Notes" box at the end of the form which will allow you to be more specific if you so desire. We now have a new fund on our on-line giving. It is called <u>Miscellaneous Non-Charitable Payment</u>. This can be used for such things as Easter Flowers, Congregational Life events such as the Faith Day at the Rockies, Mission nuts sales, VBS donation, etc.
