- Discussed this year's Stewardship emphasis "Together for Joy" and are proposing a 4% increase over the 2022 Budget
- Received written reports from committees, staff, and the commissioner to the September Presbytery meeting

MISSION

Family Promise

Building communities, strengthening lives.

The Mission Committee thanks everyone who donated to the **Gift from the Heart Disaster Kits** event and helped with assembly. Special thanks goes to the young people who opened everything except the toothbrushes to prepare for putting the kits together. Last year, we donated 60 kits and this year we nearly doubled that number to 110. With the 2 Welcome Backpacks that Mission sent in last spring, this brings UPC's 2022 donation to 112 kits. We are truly a grateful people.

Mission has worked hard since last spring to put together the Holiday Bazaar which joins the Annual Cookie Sale on December 10th. The purpose of the Annual Cookie Sale and Bazaar is to generate the UPC financial donation to Family Promise of Albany County—100% of all profit goes to Family Promise. We hope this year that UPC can write a check for \$3000 (last year, it was \$2200). Because of the interest shown by church members, fair trade items from 10,000 Villages will be available on De-As the primary purpose of this fund-raiser is to support Family Promise, Mission had to end UPC's relationship with SERRV for fair trade items when they terminated their consignment arrangements which meant that we could not return unsold items. Sarah Gorin who runs the 10,000 Villages event in November is kind enough to bring fair trade items to include in our sale on the 10th. UPC has no financial commitment in this arrangement but we did receive over \$200 from last year's sales to add to our profit from the Cookie Sale and Bazaar. Given our current expenses (the expenses are for some advertising, the nuts, the Frontier Soups, and the pastas and sauces), UPC will need to make about \$4700 in order to donate \$3000 to Family Promise. Please plan to shop at the Bazaar-there are terrific items to found ranging from 75 cents to \$30.

The gift requests from **Community Holidays** should available on-line around Thanksgiving. More information is forthcoming. Again, volunteers are needed both here at UPC and for distribution. *God bless us, everyone* (Tiny Tim)

FOC & STEWARDSHIP

Thank you for your generosity! This is how UPC stands financially at the end of September 2022:

Total Income \$171,487.66; 66.3% of 2022 operating budget.

Total Expenses \$188,231.40; 72.7% of 2022 operating budget.

The ministry of UPC continues and relies on your generosity. Please consider sending your tithes and offerings through the <u>on-line giving</u> on the UPC website or mail through the US postal service. On-line is very easy and categories that you can choose from have been created to direct your donation to the correct place. There is a "Notes" box at the end of the form which will allow you to be more specific if you so desire. We now have a new fund on our on-line giving. It is called <u>Miscellaneous Non-Charitable Payment</u>. This can be used for such things as Easter Flowers, Congregational Life events such as the Faith Day at the Rockies, Mission nut sales, VBS donation, etc.
