PASTOR MESSAGE

The use of Star Words is a prayer practice connected to Epiphany and the new year that has been growing in popularity in Protestant churches for nearly a decade. The idea is that a list of intention words, or guiding words, are written or printed on paper stars. Individuals are invited to use that word as a guiding word throughout the year. On the first Sunday of the new year, everyone in attendance received a "Star Word".

Star Words will still be available in the office or on Sunday morning for the next couple of weeks.

Once you have received your word, please place it somewhere you will see it regularly throughout the year – the refrigerator door, the bathroom mirror, next to your computer, or the dashboard of your car. Placing your star where you can see it regularly will allow you to continue to reflect on how God has moved through, around, or in connection to that word throughout the year.

Here are some questions to help you reflect on your word: *What are your initial thoughts about the word?*

What is the definition of your word?

What are the different forms your word can take? How do the different forms change its meaning?

What synonyms of your word come to mind? How do they help to shape your understanding of your word?

What scripture passages or stories does your word bring to mind? If you need some help, try going to biblegateway.com or use a Bible concord-ance to look up passages.

How might this word guide you in the coming year?

God of ink black skies and starry nights, like the Magi so many years ago, we seek you. As we receive these star words, for some of us, these words are full of meaning, challenge, and invitation already. For others, these words are a blank canvas—inviting you into our lives.


"STAR OF THE MAGI"

MISSION

Mission thanks everyone for their support of the Cookie Sale/Bazaar. The financial results will be announced after the 50% off sales following church on the 8^{th} .

The scope of community participation and cooperation in Community Holidays has grown impressively since UPC asked the Baptists if they needed some help over 6 years ago. This year, UPC continued to serve on its Board while UPC provided gifts for 50 people (12 families). Mission apologizes for the confusion over the information on the Sign Up Genius. Plans are already underway to avoid this in 2023. UPC joined other local churches, civic groups, businesses, and agencies as sponsors. The program's return to its pre-pandemic distribution method was a success. Along with the generous donations from the congregation, the sort-ing and shopping by Linda H, Linda S, Marilee, Nancy W, and Nancy L allowed UPC to reach our goal in serving our twelve families. Many thanks to Mary Prather and Nancy Weidel for joining Nancy Lick to mentor our neighbors through the distribution process to make sure that they were welcomed and didn't miss the cookies, the raffle, the wrapping paper, etc. The Community Holiday partnership is thriving with the Vedauwoo Fire Company (38 free live tree were distributed), Spring Winds (30 toiletry gift bags were prepared for residents with no local family members and, additionally, books and magazines were provided), the school (for the first time Community Holidays served school age children and their families who attended the Connections Academy or were homeschooled), the Laramie Fire Department (donates new bikes), and Toys for Tots. Cash donations from Community Groups provided food gift cards to each applicant.

The Laramie Fire Department has traditionally provided new bikes for the program and a local bike shop rehabs the used bikes that are provided by the police; however, as there are not enough bikes to meet the requests, the bikes are raffled. This year, after the bikes were raffled, another ticket was pulled for a \$50 gift certificate to the UPC Bazaar. The winner was absolutely thrilled and kept saying that she never won anything before in her entire life. She shopped at the Bazaar on the Wednesday before Christmas and had a great time. She had to be from one of UPC's 12 families as she was wearing a parka provided by UPC (she loved the warm parka that was in her "favorite" color). When asked about her last "shopping" trip, she couldn't remember as she only shops for groceries. This woman said she receives \$720/month from Social Security Disability and her husband, also on disability, receives about the same. They use his check to pay the rent and live off of her check for food and utilities. She looked at every item at the Bazaar at least 3 times before she made her selections and left with a big smile and a Merry Christmas "thank you." It was really a Tiny Tim, "God bless us, everyone," moment.

Many thanks to the children of UPC who stopped by the Bazaar for their frogs, critter books marks, and Christmas stickers. Parents, don't worry, they all said "thank you."

Mission thanks the cookie makers. Early calculations looks like the Cookie Sale will be financially more successful than in recent years. As the Community Holiday Distribution Days are usually the same week as the Cookie Sale, Mission does not have enough hutzpah to ask the congregation for additional cookies but UPC does provide purchased cookies, candy, and bagging supplies. Other members of the Community Holiday Board provides homemade cookies (this year, the children attending Sunday School at the Baptist Church provided a virtual mountain of wrapping supplies).

The next Mission Activity will be the Souper Bowl Sunday soup collection for the Interfaith Food Pantry.

Total Income \$210,807.92; 81.5% of 2022 operating budget.

Total Expenses \$235,484.59; 91% of 2022 operating budget.
