## MISSION

Mission hopes that everyone had a blessed holiday.
The February Communicator will provide the financial results of the Holiday Bazaar and the Christmas Joy Offering as those numbers will be clearer this month. Mission thanks all of our UPC Bazaar customers that were augmented by the friends and neighbors who were told about the event as well as the folks from Hospice. The most popular items so far this year have been the stuffed animals, the adult books, the jigsaw puzzles (adult), the critter pens, the adult coloring books, and the calendars. The Bronco items that were so hot last year were a hard sell this year.

Mission thanks Linda Sheets and Corrine Seebart for their help with Community Holidays. This year, the number of applications/individuals assigned to UPC was reduced at our request. This allowed us to limit the number of items for each tag. Mission had heard the comments on certain of the items and these concerns have been presented to the Community Holiday Planning Group. UPC is represented by Nancy L. She reminded everyone of the original policies of the program and how far it has deviated from these guidelines. This issue will be thoroughly discussed at their next meeting that will recap this year's program. One idea is that the application form will clearly spell out these limitations on requests but if there is a critical need, such as the wagon stroller for the mother waiting for a heart transplant, that there would be a separate application process generated by the non-profit working with the individual/family. For the first time, there were no attempts to "double dip" with applying to both the school and the Community Holiday programs. The system to check and double check with the schools to prevent this seems to be working. Meanwhile, the distribution process went smoothly resulting in a great many thankful people. It is wonderful to watch parents "shop" for the surplus items from Toys for Tots. They spend a great deal of time making sure the item that they have a chance to select is "perfect" for their child. This is the only opportunity that most have to "shop" and select gifts. The cookies and candy contributed by UPC in Christmas take-home bags were very well received though we ran out before the final distribution as we did with the donated holiday wrapping. The Vedauwoo Fire Department delivered 35 trees so the donated ornaments disappeared in a flash. What made Nancy's day was the woman who needs the transplant. She arrived slumped over and her attempt to smile wasn't matched by her eyes. When she saw the box holding her requested wagon stroller for two, she asked if that was for her. When assured that it was, she straightened up and could barely get her "thank you" out because of her real smile and tears. Nancy L only wishes that more UPC members would volunteer for one of the four twohour distribution events and get to meet our neighbors in need whom we are helping. The stories shared by her and others reinforces the need for a program such as Community Holidays that replaced the Salvation Army's Angel Tree Program.

The Presbyterian Gift Catalogs will be distributed in January. Linda Haynes is scheduled this month for a Minute for Mission on goats with Nancy Weidel presenting on chickens in February.

## UPC recently received notes from the Downtown Clinic and the Laramie Thanksgiving Dinner:
